I hope to see you in September,

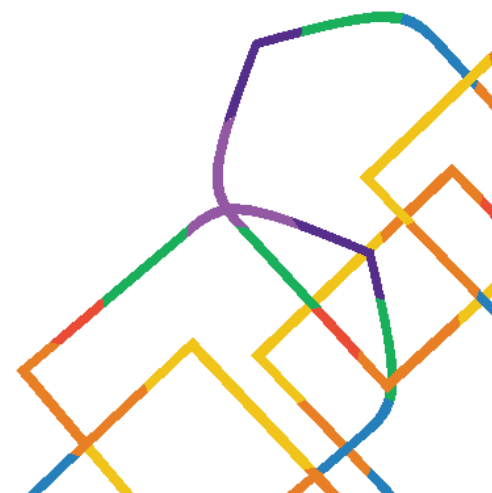

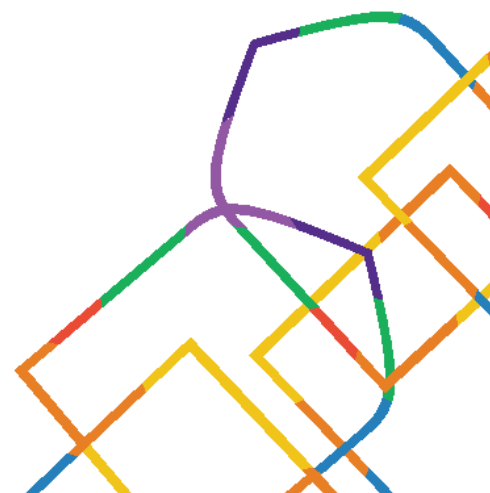
Have a wonderful summer and I look forward to seeing you in September!

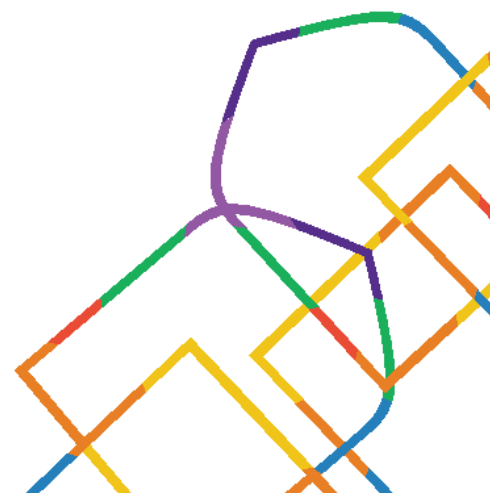
Although it seems like a big change, there is no need to worry. We are all here to help! I hope you have an amazing summer, and I look forward to seeing you in September!
